MATH DEPARTMENT






- X Comprehensive course aligned with the California Common Core Standards and integrating the new math pathways.
- X Students will experience algebraic reasoning in equation solving and graphing functions, operations using integers and rational numbers, number theory, proportional relationships, applying percents, collecting, displaying and analyzing data, probability, measurement and geometry.
- X The Integrated Mathematics Pathway offers the opportunity to focus on developing conceptual understanding and to help students see how the disciplines of mathematics are intertwined. Our existing middle school programs already use an integrated approach and thus, our high school programs would become a more natural extension of these programs, provided additional rationale for selecting this pathway through grade 12

SOCIAL SCIENCE





- Students expand their understanding of history by studying the birth of the major western and non-western ancient civilizations.
- Continued emphasis is placed on the geography, religion, achievements, political system, economy, and social structures of each unique culture. The goal is to learn the social, cultural, and technological changes that occurred around the world during this time period.
- ✓ Videos, art, symbolism, language, performance and simulations are incorporated at every turn to involve students more fully.
- Assignments are tailored to encourage the development of note-taking, organization, critical thinking skills, and expression and are designed to prepare the students for success in the next level of classes.

LANGUAGE ARTS





- X Classes are literature based and are aligned with the social studies curriculum. The program incorporates significant literary works and emphasizes not only the integration of thinking, listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills but also a multidisciplinary integration.
- X Students encounter literature from many genres and receive a mixture of culturally diverse works, including novel studies, anthologies, and expository texts.
- X Spelling and language mechanics are taught through direct instruction.
- X Student assessment will include written assignments, research-based projects, comprehension questions, and open-ended projects.

SCIENCE









- Emphasis on science process skills earth science, ecology, and ocean ecosystem.
- / Science fair project is required for all sixth graders.
- Emphasis is on making the connections and seeing the relationships between concepts and ideas.
- The interdisciplinary thematic teaching approach helps students investigate high interest problems that show students how scientific principles are applied.
- Instruction will stress scientific thinking processes and strive to help students develop critical thinking skills with problem solving, decision-making, and research and inquiry. As students move through the program, they tackle more sophisticated thinking processes using experimental manipulative and other laboratory oriented projects that are related to current scientific issues.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- X The Physical Education Department at Vista Verde has developed a co-educational based instructional program designed to encourage lifetime involvement in physical activity called "Fit for Life!"
- X Students participate in a curriculum which includes a variety of individual and team sports, including: basketball, flag football, soccer, volleyball, softball, floor hockey, team handball, Frisbee, dance, bocce ball, cooperative games, and cardiovascular and resistance training activities. Students also receive instruction in a variety of health and fitness related concepts.
- X PE instruction is enhanced through the addition of our own PE Paraprofessional, Coach Dave.











X Variety of exploratory classes designed to allow students to experience a variety of activities and skill development

X All sixth grade students take instrumental or vocal music as their exploratory class.

X Most exploratory classes change each Trimester allowing students to take multiple classes each year.






